<p>POST-MEDIEVAL 1600-1725</p> <p>Originally one room deep. Prominent central chimney. Often second-story overhang. Entrance on long side of building. Little concern for symmetry. Steep-pitched roof.</p>	<p>GEORGIAN 1725-1775</p> <p>Gambrel roof, usually. Central chimney. Ornate door surround. Clapboard siding. Symmetrical layout.</p>	<p>FEDERAL 1780-1830</p> <p>Hip roof, usually. Elliptical 'fan' window at front door. Three stories tall. Made of brick. Occasionally made of wood: Bonus points for picture of this version.</p>
<p>GREEK REVIVAL 1825-1850</p> <p>Gable roof, end facing the street. Wide/large flat trims at roof. Wide corner boards. Off-center entrance. Clapboard siding.</p>	<p>GOTHIC REVIVAL 1830-1860</p> <p>Gable or hip roof. At least one steep gable dormer. Clapboard or flat-board siding. Porch, bay window and/or balcony.</p>	<p>ITALIANATE 1845-1860</p> <p>Shallow gable roof. Towers or cupolas. Balconies and/or covered porches. Bay windows. Bracket underneath roofs.</p>
<p>SECOND EMPIRE 1860-1880</p> <p>Mansard roof. Dormers in roof. Occasional entry porch. Bay windows. Brackets underneath roofs.</p>	<p>LATE VICTORIAN ECLECTIC 1875-1920</p> <p>Mansard roof. Occasional entry porch or roof. Bay window, sometimes multi-story Brackets underneath roofs. Off-center entry.</p>	<p>COLONIAL REVIVAL 1895-1930</p> <p>Gable, hip or mansard roof. A lot of details were borrowed from Georgian, Federal and Greek Revival styles, often in combination.</p>
<p>SQUARE/ FOURSQUARE 1890-1940</p> <p>Hip roof with dormers. Front porch square footprint. Bay window. Mainly clapboard siding.</p>	<p>BUNGALOW/ CRAFTSMAN 1900-1930</p> <p>Gable or hip roof with large dormer. Large roof overhangs. Front porch with simple columns Shingles or clapboard siding.</p>	<p>MODERN/ INTERNATIONAL 1930-1950</p> <p>Flat roof. Large windows/groups of windows. Smooth siding, stucco. Minimal trim and details.</p>
<p>CAPE/CAPE COD 1930-1960</p> <p>Gable roof. Occasional dormer or two. Clapboard or shingle siding. Symmetrical facade.</p>	<p>RANCH 1950-1980</p> <p>Mainly one-story tall. Long rectangular footprint. Low-slope gable or hip roof. Clapboard or shingle siding.</p>	<p>SPLIT LEVEL (RANCH VARIANT) 1950-1980</p> <p>Two stories tall with lower floor half covered. Main entrance in between two floors. The upper story overhangs the lower.</p>
